

Personal, Social and Emotional Development	Our focus this term is all about showing resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge. We will identify what we can do to problem solve and find solutions. We will continue to think about how we can build constructive relationships and think about the perspective of others. We will continue to learn about how we can manage our own needs such as washing our hands, choosing our lunch and making choices about our learning.
Communication and Language	The children will continue to develop speaking and listening skills through stories, songs, rhymes and role play, to build familiarity and understanding. They will be learning about connecting one idea and action to another by using a range of connectives. The children will ask questions to find out more and to check their understanding and they will articulate their ideas through well formed sentences.
Physical Development	The children will continue to learn about how their bodies move and will progress towards a ore fluent style of moving with developing control and grace. They will continue to develop overall body strength, co-ordination, balance and agility. The children will be introduced to a range of large and small apparatus and will learn how to use it safely.
Literacy	The children will enjoy varied stories, rhymes, poems and non-fiction texts. They develop their reading skills by blending sounds into words so that that they can read short words made up of known letter sound correspondences. They will continue to work on forming their lower case and capital letters correctly and will write short sentences



<p>Mathematical Development</p>	<p>Children will start to learn and recall some number bonds to 10 whilst continuing to link the number symbol with its cardinal number value. They will compare numbers of 5 and think about the composition of the numbers 4 and 5. Later in the half term, the children will compare length, weight and capacity.</p>
<p>Understanding the World</p>	<p>This half term's topic is all about space. They will learn about characters from stories as well as figures from the past such as Galileo and Neil Armstrong. They will learn all about the life of an astronaut and learn about life on the ISS. They will learn about the different planets and stars as well as learning about the concept of gravity.</p>
<p>Expressive Arts and Design</p>	<p>The children will continue to be drawing, painting, printing and making models, often inspired by stories they read in class. They will be creating observational drawing and painting and use a variety of materials to make models using our imagination. They will be singing in a group or on their own increasingly matching the pitch and following the melody. They will watch and talk about dance and performance art.</p>
