

IMPORTANT - REMOTE LEARNING AT ST LUKE'S CofE PRIMARY SCHOOL

The school has finalised a protocol to ensure that parents have clear information about what expectation SLT have regarding the provision of remote education for pupils who are unable to attend school in person due to self-isolation. This applies equally if a child or a bubble is self-isolating at home.

Why?

In line with the DfE Guidance, Guidance for full opening: schools (updated 17th September 2020), the key principles underlying the schools approach are:

- To ensure that pupils have meaningful and ambitious work each day in a number of different subjects
- To ensure that pupils have access to the teaching of planned and well-sequenced curriculum where that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be taught and practised in each subject
- To ensure that pupils are provided with frequent, clear explanations of new content, delivered by a teacher in the school or through high-quality curriculum resources or videos
- To ensure teachers are able to gauge how well pupils are progressing through the curriculum, using questions and other suitable tasks and set a clear expectation on how regularly teachers will check work
- To enable teachers to adjust the pace or difficulty of what is being taught in response to questions or assessments, including, where necessary, revising material or simplifying explanations to ensure pupils' understanding
- To provide a programme of learning that is of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school, ideally including daily contact with teachers

What will it look like?

Please contact Ms Brunning, the Office Manager, in the school office as soon as you know your child is self-isolating.

The teachers shall send an email to parents/carers each day containing:

- Clear instructions about the learning
- Zoom links for the English, maths and reading lessons for the following day
- Resources your child will need to support them with these lessons
- An Oak Academy Spelling Lesson or a spelling revision activity to cover the same content as the class lesson
- A video lesson from the Phonics Fairy or a phonics revision activity to cover the same content as the class lesson
- Foundation learning to cover the same content as the class lesson which could be a project/ activity or if the pupils are learning new content in class, a Zoom link to real time teaching or Oak academy lesson (with the same content) as appropriate.

Learning Resources

All pupils were provided with comprehensive, age appropriate resources at the start of the school closure during lock down. Pupils should still have access to these resources and can be encouraged to use them to support their learning where appropriate – this will include using the exercise books and pens/pencils etc. they were given. If you are new to the school and do not have these learning resources, or if your child will need new exercise books or resources in the event of self-isolation, please speak to your child’s class teacher. If your child will not have access to a computer every day, please inform Ms Brunning, Office Manager. Where possible, the school will provide an appropriate device or alternative learning, as it is vital that any child who is self-isolating has access to the learning every day.

Reading Books

As pupils will not be able to change their reading books whilst self-isolating, please be aware of the following ways your child can access stories:

Assessment

During the lesson

During the online Zoom sessions, the teachers will be able to include the pupil/s who are learning at home in their questioning and answer sessions, gain a clear understanding of the progress made and address any misconceptions directly, and immediately.

Responding to learning

Pupils will be able to use their Class Dojo profile to communicate with the class teacher which could include uploading/sharing their learning, sharing how they felt about the lesson, any extra help or support they need. Teachers will respond to the pupil on Class Dojo before 5pm on the day of the remote learning.

Teacher Illness

In the event of teacher illness, SLT will liaise with you regarding how your child will access education remotely. SLT will ensure that your child receives the same standard of education as set out in the guidance above.
