

Books to read with
your child

- The Crowstarver by Dick King-Smith
- The Girl of Ink and Stars by Kiran Millwood Hargrave
- From Hereabout Hill by Michael Morpurgo

English	The children will read <i>Animal Farm</i> by George Orwell, identifying the purpose, features and themes of the story, and discussing the techniques that the author employs to engage, entertain and intrigue readers. They will then create their own pieces of writing, including a biography of George Orwell, character profiles, a short story, and a diary entry in the form of a letter. The children will continue to consolidate their spelling and grammar learning with an emphasis on sentence construction.
Maths	The children will investigate the properties of shapes in detail, with a particular focus on angles and drawing nets of 3D shapes. They will then spend time consolidating their learning over a range of topics including fractions, decimals and percentages, algebra, measurement and ratio and statistics. In order to deepen their understanding, they will develop efficient strategies to solve word problems.
Science	The children will focus on the topic of evolution. They will explore how fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. They will investigate how living things produce offspring that vary and are not identical to their parents. They will identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment and how adaptation may lead to evolution. They will research the work of Charles Darwin and Andrew Wallace, discussing their theories of evolution.
History	The children will explore the history of human rights and equality in Britain. They will learn how women's rights in Britain have evolved since 1918. They will look at the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, analysing how perspectives of children and childhood have changed over time. They will learn about race and ethnicity, exploring in depth the concept of immigration and understanding that Britain has been a diverse country for centuries.
Music	The children will take part in a 'Music and me' topic that will enable them to explore the concept of identity. They will focus on the work of four British female contemporary artists: Shiva Feshareki, Eska Mtungwazi, Afrodeutsche and Anna Meredith, and will also create their own music.



PSHE	The children will consider how to manage safety and risk. They will discuss the possible benefits and consequences of taking physical, emotional and social risks. They will learn about road safety, sun safety and fire safety and about how to reduce risks when near water and railways. They will learn what actions to take in an emergency or accident and how to contact the emergency services.
Art	The children will be introduced to the impressionists and post-impressionists. They will look at paintings by impressionist artists Monet, Renoir, Degas and Cassat, exploring the themes and techniques used. In response, the children will paint 'en plein air', practise using broken brushstrokes and draw modern café scenes. They will then study work of three post-impressionist artists: Cézanne, Van Gogh and Gauguin, using collage to replicate the brushwork seen in Cézanne's <i>Mont Sainte-Victoire</i> .
DT	The children will create a clay plant pot. They will research the history of pottery and study the properties of clay and will then plan, design, build and decorate their own pot, using clay moulding techniques. Finally, they will plant a seed in the finished pot.
ICT	The children will explore spreadsheets and how these can be used. They will learn to format a spreadsheet and enter specific formulae. They will investigate how spreadsheets can be used to investigate specific problems and will also create own sheet to represent data.
PE	The children will work on football skills. They will practise controlling, sending and receiving a ball accurately while moving. They will participate in football games, developing and showing an understanding of rules and tactics. The children will use exercise activities to warm-up.
RE	The children will consider the key question: Should believing in the resurrection change how Christians view life and death? They will consider the meaning of the word resurrection and discuss this as a key belief in Christian faith. They will read accounts of Jesus's death and resurrection in the four Gospels of the Bible. They will discuss how belief in the resurrection changes things for Christians and will explore Christian ideas about the resurrection in Biblical narratives, church practice and Christian living.
French	The children will learn to talk about the weather in French. They will learn the days of the week, the months of the year and the seasons and will describe what the weather is like in different places in the UK at different times of the year.
